

## INTRODUCTION

Due to overwhelming parents' request, the program was extended to 5 weeks with weekly trips and recreational activities.

It exists to provide quality and dependable summer camp learning experience whereby children are physically, academically, and spiritually challenged. It operates under the guidelines and regulations of Ebenezer Temple Pentecostal Church (ETPC), Inc.

While Camp Ebenezer is open to everyone we are here to primarily build up our local environment of residents in the 19143 zip code. The registration fee is \$50.00 per camper. A family with 3 or more siblings is only \$125.00.

The program challenges the participants in all areas of learning – spiritual, intellectual, arts, and social, it stimulates learning and interest of students and captures the entire experience of a summer camp.

Campers are expected to participate in all programs except those with physical limitations that could cause illness or injury.

The Wednesday weekly trips are at an additional cost as reflected on the application. Each year new trips added.

They will be required to submit the three clearances: Criminal, Child Abuse & FBI. (Applications are accepted on first come basis.)**

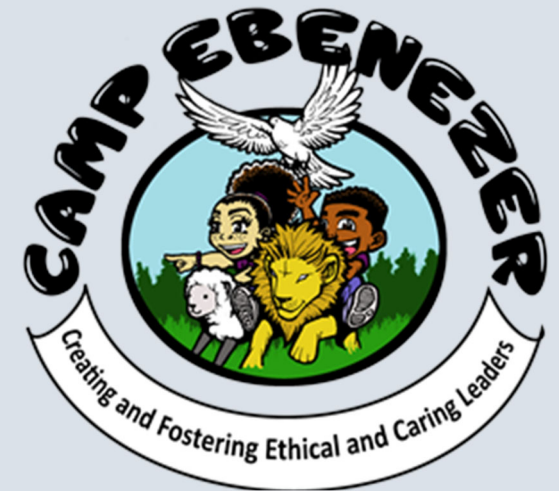

## Welcome

Welcome to Camp Ebenezer! You're in for an exciting and rewarding academic and recreational experience. Camp Ebenezer is under the auspice of Ebenezer Temple Pentecostal Church (ETPC). It is a five-week summer enrichment program designed for children and youth. This year celebrating 10 years!

## What's Offered

Camp Ebenezer offers a variety of activities to stimulate both intellectual and physical. Yearly, the activities are reviewed to ensure they are in line with the campers' needs and parents' desires.

The 2019, Courses are Bible, Math, English, Computer, Writing, Arts and Crafts, Drama and Dance. The recreational activities include trips to the playground, Library (when available). While the camp itself is free, there is a weekly trip day whereby parents are requested to subsidize the admissions and ETPC seeks grants from SCOP and Philadelphia Activity Fund to underwrite transportation costs. Therefore, the following trips are optional and are based on the vendors' admission price. Tentative trip schedule: Philadelphia Zoo, Adventure Aquarium, Sky Zone, Delaware Children's Museum, Stratosphere Trampoline Park, Franklin Institute,

Laura Sims Skate House, and Clementon Park & Splash World (this is the final day of camp).

### ETPC GOALS:

1. Developing youth to become tomorrow's ethical leaders.
2. Aiding parents in securing an affordable challenging safe haven camp for their child.
3. Enriching our children by providing a fun filled Biblical and academic based enrichment program and
4. Equipping youth with life coping skills (effectively dealing with conflict, avoiding destructive habits and live as productive citizens)

### Every day Your Child will...

Have a nutritious breakfast and lunch as well as an afternoon snack (provided free of charge also to all handicapped and anyone under the age of 18, except for those children with food allergies).

The class sizes vary depending on the number of campers registered; ideally a class size will be 10 campers or less. Counselors will have lesson plans for each session. Each class lasts 30 minutes, except for Bible which will conclude after 45 minutes.

Twice a week, their creativity is stimulated with Arts and Crafts.



## We Also Go Swimming

Campers go swimming on Monday 10:30a.m.-12:00p.m. and Friday 10:00 a.m. -12:00p.m. at Christi Recreational Center. All females must wear a one piece swim suit and males must wear swim trunks (no exceptions). Remember to bring towels, lotion, and sunscreen

Registration and payment are available online or at the site beginning March 1. There is a late registration fee of \$10 per camper for registrations received after May 31, 2020.

**Teachers on summer break are invited to apply for paid /volunteer staff positions (submit application).**
